
Mission:

Evidence Based

Problem:

Based on negative individual/ familial/ environmental factors and poor life skill attainment, high risk youth are engaging in criminal activity and gang involvement as a way to cope with their current circumstances. *ACES

What we know:

Creating a strong, trusting mentoring relationship between high-risk youth and a positive adult, who shares similar life experiences and ethnicity can help create pathways to success for both youth and returning citizens. *Credible Messenger

A collaborative approach between community members, nonprofit service providers, Juvenile Justice stakeholders, and policy makers is essential to support youth in choosing alternatives to violence and making a safer community.
