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## **ANALYSIS**

## STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

## In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Five

AN ACT relative to the penalty for certain fentanyl-related offenses.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1	1 Controlled Drug Act; Penalties. Amend RSA 318-B:26, I(a) to read as follows:
2	(a) In the case of a violation involving any of the following, a person shall be sentenced
3	to a maximum term of imprisonment of not more than 30 years, a fine of not more than \$500,000, or
4	both. If any person commits such a violation after one or more prior offenses as defined in RSA 318
5	B:27, such person may be sentenced to a maximum term of life imprisonment, a fine of not more
6	than \$500,000, or both:
7	(1) Five ounces or more of a mixture or substance containing any of the following
8	including any adulterants or dilutants:
9	(A) Coca leaves, except coca leaves and extracts of coca leaves from which
10	cocaine, ecgonine, and derivatives of ecgonine or their salts have been removed; or
11	(B) Cocaine other than crack cocaine, its salts, optical and geometric isomers
12	and salts of isomers; or
13	(C) Ecgonine, its derivatives, their salts, isomers, and salts of isomers.
14	(2) Lysergic acid diethylamide, or its analog, in a quantity of 100 milligrams or more
15	including any adulterants or dilutants, or phencyclidine (PCP), or its analog, in a quantity of 10
16	grams or more including any adulterants or dilutants.
17	(3) Heroin or its analog, crack cocaine, or a fentanyl class drug in a quantity of 5
18	grams or more, including any adulterants or dilutants.
19	(A) A fentanyl class drug in a quantity of 5 grams or more, including any
20	adulterants or dilutants, shall carry a minimum term of imprisonment of not less than 3
21	years and 6 months incarceration. A fentanyl class drug in a quantity of 28 grams or more
22	including any adulterants or dilutants, shall carry a minimum term of imprisonment of
23	not less than 7 years incarceration. The court may not defer, combine, or run concurrently
24	with any other sentence the mandatory minimum unless:
25	(i) The offender was less than 18 years of age at the time of the
26	commission of the offense for which the offender is to be sentenced;
27	(ii) The offender's mental capacity, at the time of the commission of
28	the offense for which the offender is to be sentenced, was significantly impaired to the
29	extent that the defendant was deemed incompetent. However, a voluntarily induced

intoxicated or drugged condition may not be considered an impairment for the purposes of

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this subparagraph; or

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L	(iii) The offender was an accomplice, the conduct constituting the						
2	offense was principally the conduct of another, and the offender's participation was						
}	relatively minor.						
1	(4) Methamphetamine or its analog, in a quantity of 5 ounces or more, including						
5	adulterants or dilutants.						
3	2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2026.
